At Pleckgate we encourage reading for pleasure as an integral part of our pupils' daily diet. Research shows that reading for pleasure can promote better health and wellbeing, as well as an increase in reading attainment, writing ability and self- confidence. Reading at home can create connections to the wider community and provides insight into the world view of others.

Next Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March is World Book Day and we are holding a variety of events in school to celebrate this National event.

On the day, we are asking pupils and staff to wear an accessory to represent a book e.g. Matilda - red headband, Harry Potter - cape/glasses, Alice in Wonderland - rabbit ears etc. This accessory should be worn alongside their school uniform.

Throughout the week the following events will be taking place:

## Meet the Author – Nathan Parker

Nathan Parker is an independent author and spoken artist from Blackpool. Proud of his northern roots, Nathan is a keen champion of northern voices, committed to enabling people of all ages to engage with words, stories and conversations.

Nathan Parker will be visiting Pleckgate High School on World Book Day (Thursday 6th March 2025) and holding assemblies for years 7 - 9 giving an introduction about himself, explaining why he got into writing and what inspires his work. This will be followed by two writing workshops for pupils in year 10.

## **Book extracts and reviews**

On World Book Day Year groups 7 - 10 will be given the opportunity to watch a book trailer and read an extract from five different books throughout the day. Pupils will then complete reviews on these books. This activity will give pupils suggestions of some books that are available for their age and give them a sneak peak of the book.
